



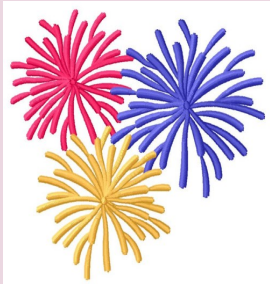

Garbage & Recycling

Weekly curbside garbage (every Tuesday) and bi-weekly blue bag services (every second Monday) are provided within the Village.

- Every collection site will receive and be required to use an automated 60 gallon roll-cart for garbage collection.
- Carts will be required to be rolled out evening prior or early morning of collection and rolled back in the evening of the collection day.

Sunnybrook Transfer Station Access

The village will be procuring Transfer Station ONE-TIME access cards that residents can then purchase at the Village Office for a cost of \$10.00/access. The card must be collected by the attendant prior to allowing access to services at the site during site operating hours, currently set as Wednesday from 9am-5pm, Thursday from 9am-5pm and Saturday from 9am-5pm.

The suitability and quantity of material shall be controlled at the discretion of the site attendant and is expected to meet with the following criteria:

- Load sizes are not to exceed a typical 8 foot (2.4 m) pickup box filled to no greater than a depth of 3 feet (0.9 m). Approximate total volume of up to 3.5 cubic yards (2.7 m³) only will be allowed per facility access.
- Vehicles exceeding three tons will not be granted access. Pickup trucks, cars, vans and utility sized trailers will be granted access.

Materials accepted at the Sunnybrook Solid Waste Transfer Station:

- Household waste
 - Household hazardous materials – used oil and filters, antifreeze, paint and oil containers, domestic cleaners, domestic pesticides, etc.
- Batteries – car, rechargeable and non-rechargeable
- White metals – appliances, intact refrigerators, freezer and enamel coated products, etc.
- Other metals – scrap metal, rebar, etc.
- Construction/demolition waste – drywall, painted/stained lumber, pressure treated wood, etc.
- Tires
- Clean non-toxic wood material
- Miscellaneous materials – furniture, bed mattress, box springs, etc.

Warburg Business Licenses

• Please be advised that, as per Village of Warburg Bylaw #8/96, any person or persons operating a business or providing goods or services to the residents of the village of Warburg must hold a current Business License. If you are currently supplying goods or services or if you anticipate supplying goods or services to the Village of Warburg residents or if you are contracted to perform work for the Village of Warburg, you must first obtain a current, valid Village of Warburg Business License. A Business License covers the calendar year of January 1st to December 31st.

Pricing is as follows and is available from the Village office or by mail. Persons violating any provision of this Bylaw may be liable, on summary conviction, to a penalty of not less than \$25.00 and not more than \$100.00 for every day in default. If you have any questions or concerns regarding this Bylaw, please contact the Village Office.

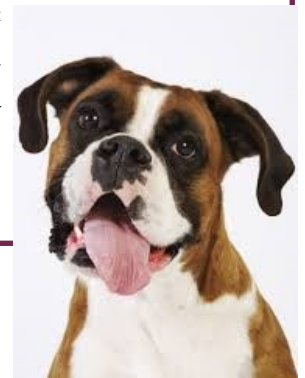
- Resident Business - \$25.00 per year
- Non-resident Business - \$50.00 per year
- Resident Hawkers/Peddlers - \$25.00 per year
- Non-resident Hawkers/Peddlers - \$50.00 per year

In addition an additional opportunity is being offered to Resident Businesses. For an additional fee of \$50.00 you may also, through the 39/20 Alliance, purchase a Regional Business License to conduct business in any of the four member communities which include the Town of Calmar and the Villages of Thorsby, Warburg and Breton. Your business would then be advertised in all four municipal business directories.

Dog Control

The following are some of the rules and regulations which must be adhered to according to Animal Control Bylaw #81/07:

1. All dogs must be registered between January 1st and January 31st, of the current year
2. All dogs must have a tag to be purchased at registration.
3. Fees are as follows:
Unaltered (Male or Female): \$50.00 /yr
Spayed/Neutered: \$20.00/yr.
4. You cannot have any more than TWO dogs of whatever sex or age at the same time in any shelter, house, room, or place within the Village.
5. No dog is allowed to run at large. A dog is considered to be "running at large" whether it be licensed or not on any occasion when it is elsewhere than on the premises of the owner or harbourer, unless at all such times the dog is on a leash of not more than 6' in length and under the immediate control of a competent and responsible person.

Off Highway Vehicles

The following are some of the rules and regulations which must be adhered to according to Off Highway Vehicles Bylaw #139/14:

1. No person who is the owner or operator of an off-highway vehicle shall operate or permit any other person to operate an off-highway vehicle within the corporate limits of the Village of Warburg, inclusive of all parkland areas except as provided for the Traffic Safety Act and this bylaw.
2. Any person who is the owner or operator of an off-highway vehicle wishing to use Village alleys, or roadways where there are no alleys, to leave the Village of Warburg or to return to their residence within the Village of Warburg must purchase a one year permit, from the Village of Warburg at a cost of \$25.00 per year to do so. Permit applicants shall first obtain proper registration and public liability insurance and property damage coverage with a limit of at least \$1,000,000.00 and proof of registration and insurance must at all times be carried on the off-highway vehicle to be produced to the Enforcement Officer(s) when requested.
3. Unless the Village grants special permission, no rally or race involving off-highway vehicles shall be permitted.
4. No person shall use off-highway vehicles to remove snow or transport refuse to the Village waste area unless they have a permit from the Village of Warburg. Permit applicants shall first obtain proper registration and public liability insurance and property damage coverage with a limit of at least \$1,000,000.00 and proof of registration and insurance must at all times be carried on the off-highway vehicle to be produced to the Enforcement Officer(s) when requested.
5. Parades: A special permit to operate must be obtained from the Municipal Administrator of the Village, for a special event, parade, exhibition etc. The Owner/Operator shall first obtain proper registration and public liability insurance and property damage coverage with a limit of at least \$1,000,000.00 and proof of registration and insurance must at all times be carried on the off-highway vehicle to be produced to the Enforcement Officer(s) when requested.

Noise

The following are some of the rules and regulations which must be adhered to according to Noise Bylaw #127/12:

1. Noise means any sound which in the opinion of a Designated Officer, having regard for all circumstances, including the time of day, location, nature of the activity generating the sound and the duration is likely to significantly annoy or disturb Persons, or to injure, endanger or detract from the reasonable comfort, repose, health, peace of safety of Persons within the boundaries of the Village.
2. Regardless of whether a Noise is actually generated, no Person shall engage in, on any Property Owned or Occupied by the Person, any construction or yard maintenance activity that has the potential to create a Noise on any weekday before 0700 hours or after 2300 hours , and on any weekend before 0900 hours and after 2300 hours.

Open Fires And Burning

The following are some of the rules and regulations which must be adhered to according to Open Fires and Burning Bylaw #80/07:

An “acceptable fire pit”

- Must have a minimum 3 meter clearance from the nearest building, property line, or combustible material.
- Must have enclosed sides made from bricks, concrete blocks, heavy gauge metal, or other non-combustible materials.

“Burnable debris” may consist of:

- Seasoned tree pruning or other seasoned wood.
- New wood material.

“Prohibited debris” is any material that when burned will result in the release to the atmosphere of dense smoke or toxic air contaminants.

1. No person shall permit an open fire or any other fire upon land owned, occupied, or under his or her control within the Village, unless a permit has been obtained, the provisions outlined on the permit are complied with and burnable debris is burned.
2. Any person wishing to obtain an Open Air Fire Permit must apply at least 48 hours in advance.

Please note: The Village of Warburg is included in all Leduc County Issued Fire Bans!

Traffic & Parking

The following are some of the rules and regulations which must be adhered to according to Traffic & Parking Bylaw #133/14:

1. All vehicles shall be parked parallel to the Curb with the right hand wheels not more than 500 millimeters from the right hand Curb or edge of the roadway except where otherwise permitted.
2. No person shall park any motor vehicle:
 - a. On any frontage but that which abuts property which they own.
 - b. So as to obstruct the use of a crossing or driveway to reach private property.
 - c. Within five meters of any intersection except where otherwise permitted.
 - d. Within five meters of a line drawn at right angles to the Curb from a fire hydrant.
 - e. In such a manner as to interfere with the proper operation on any vehicle used by the fire department or other department of the Village of Warburg.
 - f. At any place where traffic control devices or makes prohibit parking.
 - g. On a sidewalk or boulevard.
3. No Person shall park or permit to be parked a truck-tractor unit on any Highway within the Village whether or not a trailer is attached to the truck-tractor, except where such parking is expressly permitted or except for the purpose of loading or unloading such vehicle.
4. No Person shall park a vehicle in an Alley or Lane except when actively loading or unloading goods or passengers from the vehicle provided also that the vehicle concerned does not so obstruct the alley or lane as to prevent other vehicles from passing.
5. No Person shall park any trailer, whether designed for occupancy or load carrying, unless such trailer is attached to a vehicle by which it may be propelled or drawn and when so attached, the trailer shall be a part of the vehicle and subject to any regulations pertaining to the vehicle, for more than 24 hours, for such purpose of loading or unloading such trailer.
6. No commercial, farm, school bus, holiday unit, or public vehicle shall be parked on any of the streets of the Village of Warburg in the residential areas except in the conduct of its business.
7. All vehicles parked on any roadway must be moved after a snow fall accumulation of 6 inches or more to allow for cleaning of the snow from the roadway.

Traffic & Parking On Private Land

A truck tractor may park on private property only if all the following conditions are met:

1. Parking is only to take place for the winter months, namely October 15th to March 31st.
2. A parking permit is purchased at a price of \$500.00 per winter.
3. Approval must be obtained from all the neighbors within audio distance of the driveway.
4. Parking will be of the truck tractor unit only.
5. Parking will be on a driveway only.

A truck tractor which has been registered as a recreational vehicle may park on private property only if all the following conditions are met:

1. Parking may be year-round.
2. A parking permit is purchased at a price of \$100.00 per calendar year.
3. Approval must be obtained from all the neighbors within audio distance of the driveway.
4. No parking in the front yard will be allowed except on a driveway.



Sidewalks, Pedestrians

The owner or occupant of a parcel of land abutting a sidewalk shall be responsible for removing all snow, ice, dirt, debris, or other obstruction within 24 hours of the snow, ice, dirt, or other obstruction deposited thereon.

Development Permits

Section 13: Control of Development

13.1 No development other than that designated in Section 15 shall be undertaken within the Municipality unless an application for it has been approved and a development permit has been issued.

Section 15: When a Development Permit is Not Required

A Development Permit is not required for the following developments provided that the proposed development complies with all applicable regulations of this Bylaw:

- 15.1.1 Altering, maintaining or repairing any building, provided that the work does not include structural alterations or does not result in an increase in the number of dwelling units;
- 15.1.2 The completion of any development which has lawfully commenced before the passage of the Land Use Bylaw or any amendment thereof, provided that the development is completed in accordance with the terms of any permit granted in respect of it, and provided that it has commenced within 12 months of the date of approval;
- 15.1.7 Development specified in Section 618 of the Municipal Government Act;

Section 41: Fencing and Screening

- 41.1 Fences shall complement the character and quality of the principal building.
- 41.2 Fences are not permitted in the front yard of any lot. The maximum height of a fence as measured from grade shall be:
 - 41.2.1 No fence permitted for that portion of the fence which does not extend beyond the most forward portion of the principal building on the lot;
 - 41.2.2 In the case of corner lots pursuant to Section 37.
- 41.5 Notwithstanding 41.2, a higher fence or a fence with barbed or other security features may be approved for public safety, security, privacy or buffering purposes.

Warburg & District Historical Society

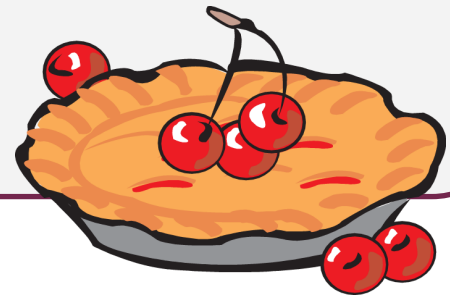

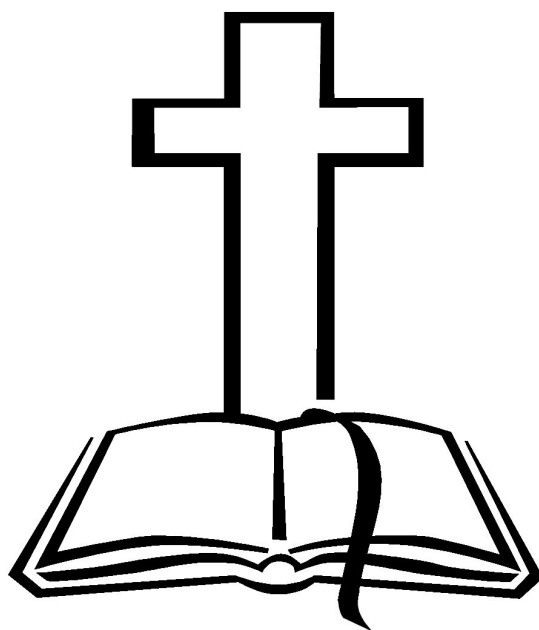
