	Mr. Clough was present to address his concerns at the Village Green Mo	bile			

Mr. Clough was present to address his concerns at the Village Green Mobile Home Park in regards to the dogs running at large and defecating on his lawn and neighboring lawns, the constant police presence at some of the residences, loud stereos playing at 6 am, fighting in the streets and holes being shot in the back of trailers. Bill noted he has complained to park management and his concerns were never dealt with and asked why the tenants of park management are not required to abide by the rules. Mr. Clough spoke with Anthony, owner of mobile home court, within the last week and 18 hours after their conversation the dog was back in his yard defecating on his lawn.

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Mr. Clough also noted that the Villages Bylaw Enforcement Officer has not been returning his calls and that she advised him that she cannot issue a ticket unless the individual making the report is willing to go to court. The process of issuing a ticket was discussed.

Mayor Kohl asked Bill what he would like Council to do and he noted that he would like the Bylaw Enforcement Officer to enforce the Bylaws at the Mobile Home Court.

Cheryl Massner, manager of Village Green, advised Council that the dog was an issue in the past and since has been taken care of and that the fighting and other matters of this sort are police issues and are not handled by management.

R. van Assen noted that the Village can act on the bylaws, but are not getting involved in the management of the Mobile Home Court.

D. Miller noted that the Mobile Home Court is not abiding by the requirement of 2 entrances due to safety issues. Ms. Massner noted that a snow pile was left in front of the gate when the Public Works show ploughed this winter.

Catherine Chaney spoke on behalf of Willie Chaney, resident of the Mobile Home Court since 1980, in regards to dogs defecating on the lots.

Councillor Elgersma asked that they all document the calls made to the Bylaw Enforcement Officer in regards to the unsightly and dog contraventions and if they are not getting their calls returned to please forward this documentation to the Village Office or to any member of Council.

## 5. c) Catherine and Dwayne Chaney

Ms. Chaney provided further information to Council in regards to the reasoning they would like their lots approved as one lot. The well is under the stairs, the garage is 2 feet from the property line and there will not be enough room for a driveway on the East side of their home. Council requested that administration look at resurveying the lots and account for the measurements of the garage. Ms. Chaney requested to be present during the time of surveying her lots.

Mr. Chaney addressed Bylaw #121/12 in regards to commercial trucks. The registration on his truck tractor is not for commercial use as it is used for recreational purposes.

Mayor Kohl noted that the Bylaw was put in place to protect the roads as we are paving roads and do not wish to have them destroyed by heavy vehicles.
