At the July 9 Council meeting, on behalf of the Warburg Bloomin' Buddies, we requested that consideration be given to having the road allowance between 52 Ave and 50 Ave running along the East side of the St. Charles Roman Catholic Cemetery, to be designated as a permanent **Canopy Walkway** and to be preserved for future generations.

Council responded very positively. Phyllis Schnick brought beautiful photos of the pathway that had been taken over all the seasons. WBB member, Art Dear, wrote a letter, making some great points and he drew up a proposed pathway that would connect to the Canopy Walkway and go all around the Village. At our WBB meeting on May 14, 2018, we discussed the long overdue planting of a memorial tree for Kevin Boucher. We just haven't been able to find the right spot.

The idea of "George Broadbent Memorial Park" had come up. It was suggested that the park could be planned as a place for memorial trees, benches, statues etc. Please see Warburg website for more info. Also discussed was the pruning of the 260 boulevard trees. Council asked for an updated quote for consideration for the 2019 budget. Linda McLaughlin agreed to do this.
