

Council approved entering into an agreement for Regional Assessment Review Services with Leduc County, Town of Thorsby and the Town of Beaumont.


Seniors' Van



Community Standards Bylaw Information

Your Home and Yard

Newsletter Date

Why?

These Community Standards will help residents and property owners understand their responsibilities in keeping Warburg a safe and clean community. The Community Standards Bylaw identifies clear expectations regarding acceptable property maintenance standards, boulevard and sidewalk maintenance, noise levels an public behavior.

Who?

Warburg Bylaw Enforcement Officers and the Royal Canadian Mounted Police enforce bylaws. Most cases involving unsightly premises and other property offences are usually handled by the Bylaw Enforcement Officers.

As a responsible citizen of the Warburg community, you are expected to uphold the bylaw. Noncompliance may result in a fine from \$57-\$1,000 and for more serious offences, up to \$10,000

Lawns & Weed

<u>Control</u>

Maintaining a healthy lawn can help keep weeds in check.

Keep grass cut lower than 15 cm (6 in.) on yards, boulevards and back lanes.

Leave grass clipping on your lawn as you mow. They will decompose and add nutrient to your lawn.

Preventing and controlling weeds is an important part of building healthy looking communities that everyone can enjoy.



The Alberta Weed Control Act requires property owners to control the growth of noxious weeds and destroy any _ prohibited noxious weeds on their

property.

Remove noxious weeds by hand, mow or spray before they go to seed including Canada thistle, mayweed, scentless chamomile and hoary cress.







COMMUNITY STANDARDS BYLAW INFORMATION

Sidewalk Snow Removal

Maintain any sidewalk adjoining and adjacent to your property to keep everyone safe.

Clear any dangerous condition caused by snow or ice within 48 hours from which the dangerous condition was formed.

Where ice builds, apply sand or salt until sidewalks are safe. Failure to remove snow or ice could result in a fine and clean-up costs.

Become a Snow Angel: Being a Snow Angel encourages Warburg residents to be good neighbors and help seniors and other neighbors in need with snow removal. Fore more information call 780-848-2841

Trees and Shrubs



Check you property and be sure that trees or shrubs are not blocking pedestrians or traffic, or hanging over sidewalks, alleyways or streets. Prune branches to a clearance trees height of 2.4 m (12 ft) above a road or alleyway and 1.2 m (8 ft) above a sidewalk. Residents are responsible to care for their property, boulevard and alleyway.

Outdoor Fires

Fire pits must have a minimum of 3 meters clearance from the nearest building, property line or nearest combustible material.

Burn only non-treated clean wood, logs and branches.

Be a good neighbor, limit smoke and noise and consider the wind conditions when burning.

Responsible Pet Ownership

Key ways to keeping you pet safe: -Ensure you obtain a yearly pet license -Spay or neuter your pet -Provide training, socialization, proper diet and appropriate medical care -Don't allow your pet to become a threat or nuisance -Keep your pet in your yard or on a leash while going for a walk.

-Please pick up after your animal. Bags are provided at the time of licensing your dog

-Excessive barking may be annoying to neighbours



Garbage & Blue Bag Recycling

Sorting recyclables will help our community achieve our 60% waste diversion target.

Your blue bags and waste cart are all you need to participate in curbside collection.



Use only the waste bins that have been provided.

Keep waste bins closed at all times except when loading and unloading.

Take cart or blue recycling bags out to curbside at
7:00 a.m. on pickup day and back to your yard by
7:00 p.m.

Ensure that there is 1m clearance on all sides of the cart including above it. Contact the Village at 780-848-2841 if your bin has been damaged and requires replacement.



<u>Compost Piles</u>: Owners or occupiers of a premises must ensure that a composting pile or container is maintained so that it does not become a nuisance by creating offensive odors or attracting pests.

NOISE

to quiet.

Noise that is reasonable likely to disturb your neighbors may be in violation of the Community Standards Bylaw.
Be respectful and only run loud equipment between the hours of 7 a.m. and I I p.m. on weekdays and 8a.m. and I I p.m. on weekends.
-Consider when and for how long you make loud noise. All residents are entitled

Recreation Vehicles

Leam the Village's rules for parking RVs on the street beside your residence.

RVs cannot be parked more than 24 consecutive hours on the street,.

RVs may be parked on the front driveway as long as they do not overhang or extend onto the street, curb, boulevard or sidewalk.

Parking unattached trailers on Village streets is strictly prohibited.

RVs cannot be occupied as temporary dwellings on public or private property.

Unsightly Premises

-Keep your property clean and uncluttered, and carry out general maintenance.

-Maintain buildings on your property. Physical deterioration or significant damages may create dangerous conditions.

-Clean up garbage and debris such as construction materials, broken furniture, vehicle parts or tires. Excessive waste is unsightly, attracts pests and poses health risks.

-Dispose of large items or old appliances such as fridges or stoves at the Sunnybrook Transfer Station.. Purchase a transfer station card at the Village Office for \$15.00. Each residence will receive one transfer station card free of charge, to be picked up the week prior to the long weekend in the Spring (May) and Fall (October) for clean up.

CANNABIS



A person shall not Smoke or Vape Cannabis in any public

place. "A public place means any premises or property whether publicly or privately owned to which members of the public have access as a right or by invitation. This includes but is not limited to: roadways, sidewalks, parking lots, parks, playgrounds."
