Parent Education Workshop

Alpha children are often described as bossy, prescriptive and controlling, demanding, competitive and can be labelled as a bully. Alpha children are not only more challenging to parent, but also predisposed to a number of problems including anxiety, aggression, oppositionality and eating problems. The root of the problem - the alpha dynamic - is one of the least known and yet most impactful factors in a relationship. 





SUPPORTING RURAL MENTAL HEALTH

This past year has been challenging for many of us and our families, friends, neighbours and communities. A global pandemic, economic uncertainties, financial stress and many changes to our everyday routines has been a lot to deal with and can result in increased stress and feeling overwhelmed.

Stress can lead to anxiety, depression and even suicide. An important step in mental health is watching out for each other. Sometimes it can be hard to know what to do, and you may not be aware of the resources available that can help.

If you notice any of the following signs in your neighbours, family or friends, it may be time to reach out and offer help.

Signs that someone may need help:

- consistently expressing sadness or hopelessness
- unable to concentrate or focus
- constantly exhausted
- unusual irritability

How you can help:

- Ask the person what they need.
- Ask if they have someone they can talk to, such as a friend, spouse or doctor.
- Use the tips listed under reducing stigma, page 2.
- Contact Leduc County FCSS to learn more.

- When you are healthy?
- · Practice self care.
- When you are stressed?
- · Manage your eating, sleeping and exercise.



ATTENTION: ALL EVENT ORGANIZERS





Good afternoon Municipal Leaders.

As leaders in your communities, you continue to play an important role in helping Albertans balance the realities of COVID-19. This includes promoting safety at events, such as religious gatherings, sporting tournaments and public meetings which can pose risk of COVID-19 spread but also benefit attendees emotionally, spiritually or physically.

We therefore ask that you share the following message with municipal staff, and those in your communities who organize and host public events.

As of October 26, organizers of events at which attendees are exposed to COVID-19 will be engaged by Alberta Health Services (AHS) in managing notification of event contacts.

If a positive case attended an event while infectious, AHS Public Health will now notify the organizer of the event, and provide that organizer with written notification that the organizer will be directed to email to all event attendees.

We will be asking event organizers to send these emails within 24 hours of us contacting them.

Previously, AHS Public Health was contacting all event attendees by phone. This change will improve the efficiency of the close contact notification process for events such as sports tournaments, weddings, church socials and other gatherings of 10 or more people.

If an event organizer can't support this more rapid email notification process, AHS Public Health will continue to conduct the contact tracing directly.

AHS Public Health will also continue to directly notify close contacts of cases who were exposed outside of any event, and of course: AHS will continue to directly contact all Albertans who test positive for COVID-19.

To support you in managing the risks associated with social, sporting and other events, we have established a new webpage containing pre- and post-event checklists, and other supports at www.ahs.ca/events.

As we continue to work together to reduce the risk of COVID-19 in Alberta, you are an important partner. We aim to keep you informed of changes that impact event organizers. As well as these direct communications, you can subscribe to AHS' weekly e-newsletter, *Together4Health Headlines*, which provides updates on public health measures, health services and other important information aimed at supporting Albertans during these challenging times. 
A letter of support was sent for the New Horizons for Seniors grant for floor renovations at the Cultural Centre for the Warburg Cultural Society.
