The Village of Warburg is committed to the health and safety of our community members. Adhering to the new Enhanced Measures for the Edmonton Zone (which includes the Village of Warburg and all Leduc County residents) announced by the Provincial Government on November 24th, please be advised that the following restrictions are currently in effect:

* Masks are mandatory for all indoor work places, unless you are separated from other staff/visitors

Alpha Children Parent Education Workshop

Alpha children are often described as bossy, prescriptive and controlling, demanding, competitive and can be labelled as a bully. Alpha children are not only more challenging to parent, but also predisposed to a number of problems including anxiety, aggression, oppositionality and eating problems. The root of the problem - the alpha dynamic - is one of the least known and yet most impactful factors in a relationship. While the focus of the workshop is on children, the revelations and challenges are for us as adults.

This is a four week registered workshop that will be held virtually (online) through a secure video meeting platform. It includes four online sessions of video material along with interactive workshop activities and will be facilitated by a social worker. Participation requires internet access by computer, laptop or smartphone. If you are a two-parent family, we encourage both parents to attend the sessions if possible.

Leduc County Family and Community Support Services (FCSS) is now a provincial Family Resource Network (FRN) hub.

Provincial FRNs deliver high quality prevention and early intervention services and supports for children aged 0 to 18.

Networks provide a range of services and supports that focus on strengthening parenting and caregiving knowledge, social support, coping and problem-solving skills, access to community supports and resources, improving child and youth development, building resiliency and fostering well-being.

FRN supports

Leduc County FRN offers the following supports, in addition to referrals for cultural supports through the Creating Hope Society of Alberta.

Home visitation: long-term support, mentorship, and advocacy for pregnant women and/or parents with a baby less than one-year old; for "at risk" families.

Parent education: information, referrals and parenting workshops such as Positive Discipline for Everyday Parenting, Circle of Security, Nobody's Perfect and Kids Have Stress Too. Participation is open to all community members.

► Family support: in-home support for "at risk" families who have children aged one to 18. We provide information about parenting and child development, and connections to other supports in the community.

► Developmental screens: Leduc County FRN will provide the Ages and Stages questionnaire that is designed to help you monitor your child's physical, intellectual and emotional development at regular intervals for children two-to-60 months old.

Expanded Electronics Pilot Project Recycling Update

Please take your electronics for recycling to the recycle facility located 1 mile West of the Arena. Hours of operation: Thursday & Saturday, 9:00 am to 5:00 pm. Items accepted include small appliances, audio visual, telecom (cell phones, answering machines), power & air tools, and games/toys/music items.

Being just two months into the expanded electronics recycling pilot project, the Alberta Recycling Management Authority reports that 98% of the 137 registered municipal & indigenous collectors have signed up to participate in the ePilot. This project is expected to generate an additional 24,600 tonnes of electronic products for recycling with the potential to inject an additional \$30 million annually into Alberta's economy. The ePilot is helping to reduce municipal landfill waste, supporting environmental protection and moving Alberta towards being a significant contributor to the emerging circular economy.

Bylaw Reminders

Thank you to all residents for clearing sidewalk snow in a timely manner!

Bylaw 27/98 (Snow Removal) states:

Every occupant, and in case there is no occupant, then the owner of every house, shop, building, lot or parcel of land and every person having charge or care of any public building shall, within the first fourty-eight (48) hours after every fall of snow cause the same to be removed off the sidewalks from or abutting on each house, shop, building, lot or parcel of land respectively and shall **also keep the said sidewalk free of all snow and ice which may be deposited there on**. That in the event of any person failing to comply with Sections 3, 4 and 5 of this by-law, The Village of Warburg may carry out the removal of snow, ice or dirt with all costs involved being charged to the owner of the property.

That no person shall place snow, ice or dirt from private property, such as driveways, parking lots, service station lots, etc. on any street

In addition, please be respectful to residents when clearing snow. Avoid packing down snow with tires from quads and snow blowers.

Traffic Bylaw 133/14 states:

- 7.11 No person shall leave, store or deposit or permit to accumulate on any highway or sidewalk any article or thing that may create a nuisance or danger or interfere with the proper use of the highway or sidewalk.
- 13.1 No person shall drive, upon a roadway or on any Highway, any Vehicle so as to result in depositing mud, slush, ice or any other object or debris as to cause a hazard to other users of the Highway. Any violators are responsible for the clean up.
