The increasing level of anxiety in children has many parents and caregivers looking for an explanation as well as a solution. In the Making Sense of Anxiety workshop, Dr. Gordon Neufeld sheds light on this topic, and discusses various ways anxiety can show up in children, including obsessions, compulsions, agitation, adrenalin-seeking and self-harming behaviours.

SUPPORTIVE CARE ASSISTANT PROGRAM - PROGRAM OUTLINE—<u>FULLY SUBSIDIZED TUITION!!!!!!!!!!</u>

The Supportive Care Assistant Program is a new fully subsidized micro-certificate developed to address the labour shortages in the long-term care sector. The program allows students to discover a new career, gain work experience, and make a difference in their community. The micro-certificate includes six weeks of online training and a four month paid work placement. This program can help accelerate the next step of a students career if they chose to pursue further studies and become a fully certified personal care provider. The program is funded by Employment and Social Development Canada and is part of CICan;s Building Capacity in Long-term Care project.

Admission Requirement:

- Must be at least 18 years old
- -Must be a Canadian Citizen, permanent resident or person who has been granted refugee status (international students cannot register).
 - Legally entitled to work in Canada according to the relevant provincial legislation and regulations
 - Grade 10 English

Cost:

There is no cost for tuition to register for the Supportive Care Assistant Program. Bursaries are available for dependant care and transportation during the student's work placement. Students may be expected to cover certain costs associated with the placement including a criminal record check or other employment requirements (ex. Appropriate clothing or footwear)

Application deadlines and how to:

The online training is delivered asychnronously. Portage College is accepting applications on an ongoing basis. Once the Student is approved, they can begin the training. Students can register for the SCAP by contacting Portage College Continuing Education at sca@portagecollege.ca



Property Maintenance

201. Accumulation of Materials

- No owner or occupant of a premises shall allow on the premises the accumulation of yard material, animal remains, parts of animal remains, animal feces, any material that creates unpleasant odours or is likely to attract pests, or disassembled machinery, equipment, fuel tanks and appliances and parts thereof;
- No owner or occupant of a premises shall allow loose garbage, bottles, cans, boxes, packaging materials, household furniture or other household goods to accumulate on the premises such that the accumulation is visible to a person viewing from outside the property.

206. Control of Weeds and Unmaintained Vegetation on Premises or Property

- 1. An owner or occupants of a premises shall
 - a.) mow or carry measures designed to inhibit premises or property of nuisance or noxious weeds of the premises or property be infested with weeds;
 - b.) cut, mow or carry out measures designed to inhibit propagation of uncontrolled grass or other vegetation from May 1st through to October 31st to ensure it does not exceed 10 cm or 4" in height, weather permitting;
 - c.) remove or prune any and all trees that, due to a deterioration or condition or for any other reason interfere with any adjacent property, public utility or public works, or curb sight lines, and are or could be a public safety hazard, including lines, poles, conduits, pipes, sewer or other works of the Village of Warburg on their premises or property;
 - d.) remove or prune any shrub which is or could be a nuisance to any person using a publicly owner or maintained sidewalk or street.

Nominations are accepted from January 1 to September 20, 2021 @ noon.

Eligibility: You can become a candidate if the following applies to you:

- ⇒You are 18 years of age on nomination day
- ⇒You are a Canadian citizen

You are not eligible to become a candidate if any of the following apply: you are the auditor of the municipality; you are an employee of the municipality, unless you have taken a leave of absence; your current property taxes are more than \$50 in arrears; you are in default for any other debt to the municipality in excess of \$500 for more than 90 days; or you have been convicted of an offense under the Local Authorities Election Act or the Canada Elections Act in the previous 10 years.

For specific eligibility and ineligibility descriptions for candidates, refer to sections 21 and 22 of ther Local Authorities Election Act.

Starting January 1, 2021, candidates can submit their nomination forms at the following address: Village of Warburg, 5212—50 Avenue, Warburg AB. Candidates are encouraged to deliver their nomination forms in person, however, anyone may file the nomination papers on the candidate's behalf. Returning Officer Christine Pankewitz can be contacted at 780-848-2841 for further information or questions. Nominations close September 20th, 2021 at noon.

Nomination forms are available for pick-up at the Village Office. Nomination forms must be signed by at least five voters eligible to vote in the election and who also reside in the Village of Warburg. To ensure validity of nomination forms, a candidate is encouraged to submit more than the required five elector's signatures.

Responsibilities: Council members have the opportunity to significantly influence the future of the Village of Warburg; this is an important and demanding job. If you are elected, you will hold office for a four-year term and will be required to attend the following:

- ⇒ Regular and special council meetings
- ⇒ Council committee meetings
- ⇒ Meetings of other boards and agencies to which you are appointed as a council representative
- ⇒ Conferences, conventions, seminars and workshops for training and discussion
- ⇒ Other events promoting the municipality.
