What is the Adventurer Club?

A unique Christian club for children (similar in some aspects to Cubs and Brownies) where recognition is given to children as unique people with special talents. During the club's activities children learn to take pride in what they do, strengthen abilities, and develop positive character qualities as they grow and learn together while completing projects and class awards. The Adventurer Club is sponsored by the Seventh-day Adventist Church.

Who can participate?
