





#### Houskeeping subsidy

Provides access to affordable housekeeping services through a partnership with Serving Hands Senior Care Inc.

To be eligible for the housekeeping subsidy, you must:

- Be a senior (65+) or an adult with a disability or inability to complete household task.
- · Meet annual income thresholds.
- Be a resident of Leduc County (including New Sarepta), Calmar, Thorsby or Warburg.

Housekeeping fees are determined based on family income level and eligibility to other subsidies. Seniors who are eligible for subsidy from the Government of Alberta will be assisted with applications.



## WELCOME TO WARBURG, WEST OF THE FIFTH!

#### Our Story

Though they come from different academic backgrounds, partners of the firm, Linnée and Clayton both enjoy a good debate and a challenge - something law school happily provided. After meeting during their first semester of law school the two quickly became friends and within a few months started dating. They got engaged during their articles, and recently celebrated the birth of their first child, Ophelia.

The idea of West of the Fifth came to be during their second year of law school when both lawyers realized that the big firm, busy life in the city lifestyle wasn't for them. A small town firm that served the local community quickly became their model. They wanted a firm that was flexible and innovative while still providing quality service- it was simply a matter of where. Clayton graduated from Breton High School in 2006, and his parents are still active members of the community. So while there were many places to choose from across Alberta, there's nowhere quite like home.

As a rural firm, Linnée and Clayton wanted to cover as many areas of law as possible. Right now, they offer a variety of barrister and solicitor services - including family and criminal law, estate planning and administration, as well as real estate and civil litigation. Independent legal advice and consultations are also offered if you're not quite sure where you fall on the legal spectrum. Understanding the remoteness of these small towns, Linnée and Clayton are also available for appointments in Pidgeon Lake and Sangudo, with the option to do house calls and online intakes. Due to the small nature of the firm, meetings are by appointment only.

Shortly after opening in Summer 2020, West of the Fifth got a lot busier than initially anticipated. The firm brought on Sierra- a recent UBC alumni and sister to Linnée - as Legal Assistant and later Paralegal to help manage files. Clients continued to call, and more support staff was needed. Local Thorsby resident, Carol, provided critical assistance by taking over Real Estate Conveyancing particularly during the busy summer months. Maddy, a Breton graduate, was brought on as Office Manager to take over communications and oversee day-to-day operations.

Expanding to more areas and providing more services has always been a big goal for Linnée and Clayton. The initial steps of adding additional lawyers and staff have already begun in the hopes of bringing affordable legal services to neighboring communities. West of the Fifth is off to a great start, thanks to your support.

#### April 11th, 2022 Council Meeting

#### **2021 Financial Statements**

Donnelly & Co LLP presented the Report of the Auditor for the year ended December 31, 2021 and the Consolidated Financial Statements for the Year ended December 31, 2021. Both reports were Approved by Council. Copies of the Financial Statements are available on the Village website or at the Village office.

#### **MSI Grants**

Council allocated the 2022 MSI Operating Grant in the amount of \$92,582 towards the operation of various departments within the Village. The 2022 MSI Capital Grant in the amount of \$110,914 and the Canada Community-Building Fund in the amount of \$50,000 were allocated to the 2022 Paving Project.

#### National Police Federation-Call to Action

Council accepted, as information, the National Police Federation's invitation to join their Call to Action.

What is the Call to Action? The Call to Action is to have the Government of Alberta halt the idea of a new provincial police service and to invest the proposed new monies into underfunded critical services within Alberta such as resourcing, staffing shortages and social support programs. NPF polling showed that 84% of Albertans support retaining the RCMP. The Government of Alberta's Transition Study estimated that over just a six-year period costs would total over \$1.2 billion.
