



If the weather is not cooperating, I will email you for changes. If your name is not on my email group please let me know what your email is and I will add it. Thank you so much!


I am so proud of our community. If anyone has any good ideas of where we could plant sunflowers, let me know.

Could they be a benefit to you?

Seniors Services provides preventative social programs that assist seniors and adults with disabilities in maintaining their independence and enhancing their quality of life.

Provides access to affordable housekeeping services through a partnership with Serving Hands Senior Care Inc.

To be eligible for the housekeeping subsidy, you must

- Be a senior (65+) or an adult with a disability or inability to complete household task.
- · Meet annual income thresholds.
- . Be a resident of Leduc County (including New Sarepta), Calmar, Thorsby or Warburg.

Housekeeping fees are determined based on family income level and eligibility to other subsidies. Seniors who are eligible for subsidy from the Government of Alberta will be assisted with applications

Seniors Services also offers one-to-one support to assist you with:

- · Information and referrals to other local re-
- Assistance with forms and applications.
- · Advocacy and coordination of services.
- . Goal setting and future planning

Financial Empowerment Program

Leduc County Family and Community Support Service's (FCSS) Financial Empowerment Program allows you to explore how you can pay your bills, manage your debt, afford basic necessities and get ahead

The program is free and confidential. Trained staff are here to listen and learn about what is important to you, offer you options and provide information based on your needs and interests. You take the lead and set the pace. Your knowledge and living experience is unique to you.

One-to-one* sessions are available to help you:

- ▶ Get ready for income tax filing and file your taxes for free** OR teach you how to file your own taxes.
- Learn about the subsidies, grants, benefits and supports that may be available to you.
- Identify the financial challenges that are holding you back.
- Create action plans to meet your goals.
- Access the right support and services with helpful referrals to community agencies that provide specialized financial information and support.
- Increase your basic money management skills so that you can reduce debt, grow savings, build assets and make informed financial decisions.

In addition to one-to-one support, we also offer information sessions and workshops on a variety of financial literacy topics. Check out our recorded sessions and upcoming events at leduc-county.com/community-family.

Leduc County is one of a select group of Canadian municipalities to partner with Prosper Canada on the Prosperity Gateways-Cities for Financial Empowerment project to improve the financial well-being of residents living on low income. Subsidized counselling service

Short-term preventative counselling supports people who are struggling with common, everyday issues. Leduc County Family and Community Support Services (FCSS) offers subsidy to residents of rural Leduc County, Calmar, Thorsby and Warburg to ensure everyone can afford the cost of counselling.

Counselling fees are determined on a sliding scale based on family income and family size. In order to be eligible for subsidy, your family income must be less than \$75,000 per year. Services are provided by local counsellors and are available in person, over the phone or virtually.


