
Uncle Johns Fireworks put on a Spectacular fireworks display entertained so many was a great finish to the day sponsored by Capital Power and Leduc County Recreation.

Leduc County Family and Community Support Service's (FCSS) Financial Empowerment Program allows you to explore how you can pay your bills, manage your debt, afford basic necessities and get ahead.

The program is free and confidential. Trained staff are here to listen and learn about what is important to you, offer you options and provide information based on your needs and interests. You take the lead and set the pace. Your knowledge and living experience is unique to you.

One-to-one* sessions are available to help you:

- Get ready for income tax filing and file your taxes for free** OR teach you how to file your own taxes.
- Learn about the subsidies, grants, benefits and supports that may be available to you.
- Identify the financial challenges that are holding you back.
- Create action plans to meet your goals.
- Access the right support and services with helpful referrals to community agencies that provide specialized financial information and support.
- Increase your basic money management skills so that you can reduce debt, grow savings, build assets and make informed financial decisions.

Seniors Services provides preventative social programs that assist seniors and adults with disabilities in maintaining their independence and enhancing their quality of life.

louskeeping subsidy

Provides access to affordable housekeeping services through a partnership with Serving Hands Senior Care Inc.

- To be eligible for the housekeeping subsidy, you must:
 - · Be a senior (65+) or an adult with a disability or inability to complete household task.
 - Meet annual income thresholds.
 - · Be a resident of Leduc County (including New Sarepta), Calmar, Thorsby or Warburg.

Housekeeping fees are determined based on family income level and eligibility to other subsidies. Seniors who are eligible for subsidy from the Government of Alberta will be assisted with applications.

Seniors Services also offers one-to-one support to assist you with:

- · Information and referrals to other local resources
- Assistance with forms and applications.
- · Advocacy and coordination of services.
- Goal setting and future planning.

Subsidized counselling service

Short-term preventative counselling supports people who are struggling with common, everyday issues. Leduc County Family and Community Support Services (FCSS) offers subsidy to residents of rural Leduc County, Calmar, Thorsby and Warburg to ensure everyone can afford the cost of counselling.

Counselling fees are determined on a sliding scale based on family income and family size. In order to be eligible for subsidy, your family income must be less than \$75,000 per year. Services are provided by local counsellors and are available in person, over the phone or virtually.

Council approved that the Village proceed with extending the 48th Street paving onto 51st Avenue going east from 48 Street and ending prior to 49 Street.

2022 ARPA Conference

The Village will send 2 representatives to attend Alberta Recreation and Parks Association Conference on behalf of the Village.

ID Tractor with Attachments

The Village accepted the highest tender in the amount of \$10,500.00 for the JD Tractor with attachments.

Federal Funding for Rural Municipalities

Council approved that administration send a letter to address concerns in regards to Broadband, disparity between rural and big city funding and RCMP Funding, to M.P. Shannon Stubbs.

Rural Communities Foundation

The Village will work with the Pioneer Agricultural Society on applying for a Rural Communities Foundation Grant for a pump track and finding a location for the pump track.

Did you know.....information on the Yellow-headed spruce sawflies

Adult yellow-headed spruce sawflies deposit eggs into the base of spruce tree needles in spring. This insect can cause significant damage to the tree by reducing growth, killing branches and can eventually kill the tree. Some management options for the control of the yellow-headed spruce sawfly are: hand picking the insect off small trees and dispose of in a plastic bag, prune branches with larvae and dispose in a plastic bag, insecticidal soap against young larvae. 11
