

POSITION SUMMARY: - Responsible for efficient implementation of the overall upkeep, repair and replacement programs of all existing municipal property and facilities.



WARBURG BUSINESS OF THE MONTH

WARBURG SEED CLEANING CO-OP



The Warburg Seed Cleaning Co-op started in 1964 when farmers in need of a better way of cleaning their seed and controlling the spread of weed seeds got together to raise 1/3 of the funds needed to build the plant. The other 2/3 of the funds came from Leduc County and the province of Alberta. In the early years, the main business was just seed cleaning. Over the years, the business has grown to include Forage seed sales, grass seeder rentals, canola gathering point for Canbra Foods which eventually was taken over by Richardson Pioneer, obtained more land for our bin yard which meant we could offer more varieties of seed to sell, ring road to accommodate the large trucks and trailers. Warehouse so we could better handle forage seed and tote bags. It also gave us a better place to conduct repairs and storage. Part of the warehouse also serves as AWSA compliant herbicide storage for chemical sales. 2010 saw the installation of an optical sorter and a new wind & screen. The color sorter was a major advancement to grain cleaning. In the past few years, the plant has seen some major updates, such as a new gravity table, a 4000 bu. bin for incoming seed storage, 6000 bu. of overhead clean seed storage, the addition of a 90 foot truck scale and a new color sorter with true color and infrared cameras for even more advanced cleaning capabilities. We also added a roller mill and blender for feed sales so we can offer a variety of feed grains in small 50-pound bags, mini bulk bags or bulk. Financial Empowerment Program

Leduc County Family and Community Support Service's (FCSS) Financial Empowerment Program allows you to explore how you can pay your bills, manage your debt, afford basic necessities and get ahead.

The program is free and confidential. Trained staff are here to listen and learn about what is important to you, offer you options and provide information based on your needs and interests. You take the lead and set the pace. Your knowledge and living experience is unique to you.

One-to-one* sessions are available to help you:

- ▶ Get ready for income tax filing and file your taxes for free** OR teach you how to file your own taxes.
- Learn about the subsidies, grants, benefits and supports that may be available to you.
- Identify the financial challenges that are holding you back.
- Create action plans to meet your goals.
- Access the right support and services with helpful referrals to community agencies that provide specialized financial information and support.
- Increase your basic money management skills so that you can reduce debt, grow savings, build assets and make informed financial decisions.

In addition to one-to-one support, we also offer information sessions and workshops on a variety of financial literacy topics. Check out our recorded sessions and upcoming events at leduc-county.com/community-family.

Could they be a benefit to you?

Seniors Services provides preventative social programs that assist seniors and adults with disabilities in maintaining their independence and enhancing their quality of life.

Provides access to affordable housekeeping services through a partnership with Serving Hands Senior Care Inc.

To be eligible for the housekeeping subsidy, you must:

- Be a senior (65+) or an adult with a disability or inability to complete household task.
- · Meet annual income thresholds.
- . Be a resident of Leduc County (including New Sarepta), Calmar, Thorsby or Warburg.

Housekeeping fees are determined based on family income level and eligibility to other subsidies. Seniors who are eligible for subsidy from the Government of Alberta will be assisted with applications.

Seniors Services also offers one-to-one support to assist you with:

- · Information and referrals to other local resources
- Assistance with forms and applications.
- Advocacy and coordination of services.
- Goal setting and future planning.



We hope they inspire you to enjoy the berries and the great outdoors!



Survey Regarding Chickens

Council will conduct a survey with Village residents to provide feedback regarding chickens within the Village.

Signs

Council approved that the Village assign a budget to a maximum of \$3,500 for the property opportunity signs as per the proposal received from Nichols Applied Management.

Water and Sewer Services on 48th Street

Council approved that the Village approve the quote to install the water/sewer services, in the amount of \$14,850, to the park at 5031-48th Street to be completed prior to road paving.

Directional Signs

The Village will allocate \$3,000 towards the directional signs and order 6 posts, 12 wings and the caps required as per Council.

2022 AB Municipalities Convention

Council approved that all Council members and the Municipal Administrator be authorized to attend the AB Municipalities Convention.

Paving

The groundwork for paving has been completed on 48th Street. The actual paving of 48 St between 50 Ave and 52 Ave with an apron onto 51 Ave. part way between 48 St and 49 St. will begin at point the week of August 2nd, as per the following page. Any residents willing to contract the paving company for private paving of approaches, driveways etc. can call Tyler Spence at 780-818-8299. Any updates will be posted on the Village website when available.

Residents on 48 Street between 50 Ave and 52 Ave are asked to roll their garbage bins and place any recycling in the alley during this time.

NOTICE OF CONSTRUCTION

Warburg - Road Improvements

We would like to inform the residents in the area that the street in front of your property is scheduled to have Road Reconstruction starting at some point the week of August 2nd. Please refer to the Coloured area in the figure below for the streets being reconstructed. In order reconstruct the roads, we will need to close the road being reconstructed. Rear alley access will be maintained for at least one entrance for the duration of construction, if your property has a laneway at the back of the property. Construction will begin on 48 Street and 51 Avenue. Once 48 Street and 51 Avenue is excavated and being graveled, then 46 Street and 51 Avenue excavation will start (in mid- August). Once the gravel is in on 46 Street and 51 Avenue, the concrete for both areas will be scheduled. It is expected that paving will happen in mid to late September.



Residents will be expected to park in the rear alleys during construction in order to allow for the road reconstruction work to proceed. We will look for street parking opportunities for those of you who do not have a laneway at the back of your property. Residents will be expected to cooperate with the parking restrictions in order to allow for the street improvements in front of their property to progress. During construction there will be traffic flow interruptions and we ask for patience and cooperation during these inconvenient times. We also ask that residents keep their distance from the equipment and watch their children for all of the obvious safety reasons. We apologize in advance for any inconveniences due to construction and we thank you for your cooperation during these inconvenient times.

Once any concrete is poured, we ask that it is not driven on for at least 7 days to allow for the concrete to cure properly and obtain the strength required to support a vehicle weight. We ask that residents water the seeded areas behind any concrete replacement regularly in order to ensure proper growth.
