WARBURG BUSINESS OF THE MONTH

Canada Post Warburg

In 1916, Winfield Scott was advised of the approval of a post office in Warburg. So on February 15, 1916 the mail service commenced. Later, in 1918 Halvar Halverson, who lived right outside of Warburg opened a post office in his home. When the railroad came through Warburg in 1929, the officials gave notice the post office had to be in the town.

A post office was built at 5003-52 Street. Halvar's daughter, Edith and her husband Pete ran it. Later, Pete and Halvar built a new post office at 5011-52 Street. Then in 1957, Vernon, who was Halvar's son took over as post master. This is when mail delivery began to the rurals. Later, 5218-50 Avenue because home to the post office. This is the location the post office is at today. Since that time, there have been a few different post masters: Marion Ellis, Mary Gellert and Diana Bachand.

We now have a staff consisting of Michelle Brown, Pamela Jehn, Tracey Yurystowski and Josephine Walters. Come and meet us here at the post office. Cultural Appreciation or Appropriation? Lunch and learn series

Join Leduc County Family and Community Support Services and Christine Sokaymoh Frederick for a presentation that engages the complex dynamics surrounding cultural appropriation. The presentation will be presented from an Indigenous perspective and will include definitions, history in Canada, examples of what not to do and recommendations

Christine Sokaymoh Frederick is the Executive Artistic Director of the Dreamspeakers Festival Society and producer of the annual Dreamspeakers Indigenous Film Festival (DIFF) and the Rubaboo Arts Festival. She is Cree-Métis with forty years of artistic experience. She is the first Indigenous Associate Artist of the Citadel Theatre and served on many artistic boards including the Edmonton Symphony Orchestra, the Edmonton Arts Council and Alberta Foundation of the Arts. She served on the committees for the ÎNÎW River Lot 11^{so} — one of the first Indigenous Public Art Parks in the world — the City of Edmonton's Indigenous Artist in Residence and the National Advisory Committee for the National Arts Centre's Creation Fund. She produced and performed in a dance theatre double-bill national tour of Bears by Matt MacKenzie and her own play Minosis Gathers Hope. She is the recipient of the 2007 Esquao Award in Arts and the 2016 Mayor's award for Excellence in Artistic Leadership.

Could they be a benefit to you?

Seniors Services provides preventative social programs that assist seniors and adults with disabilities in maintaining their independence and enhancing their quality of life.

Houskeeping subsid

Provides access to affordable housekeeping services through a partnership with Serving Hands Senior Care Inc.

To be eligible for the housekeeping subsidy, you must:

- . Be a senior (65+) or an adult with a disability or inability to complete household task.
- · Meet annual income thresholds.
- . Be a resident of Leduc County (including New Sarepta), Calmar, Thorsby or Warburg.

Housekeeping fees are determined based on family income level and eligibility to other subsidies. Seniors who are eligible for subsidy from the Government of Alberta will be assisted with applications.

Seniors Services also offers one-to-one support to assist you with:

- Information and referrals to other local resources.
- · Assistance with forms and applications.
- Advocacy and coordination of services.
- · Goal setting and future planning.

Subsidized counselling service

Short-term preventative counselling supports people who are struggling with common, everyday issues. Leduc County Family and Community Support Services (FCSS) offers subsidy to residents of rural Leduc County, Calmar, Thorsby and Warburg to ensure everyone can afford the cost of counselling.

Counselling fees are determined on a sliding scale based on family income and family size. In order to be eligible for subsidy, your family income must be less than \$75,000 per year. Services are provided by local counsellors and are available in person, over the phone or virtually.



Backvard Chicken Survey

Council approved that the Backyard Chicken Survey, as amended, be sent to residents with the September utility bill.

Bylaw #181/22 Given Final Reading

Bylaw #181/22 known as the Water, Wastewater, Solid Waste and Recycling Bylaw amendment was given its final reading. Some of the amendments include the rate changes for water, sewer and garbage service. Residents will see an increase of approximately \$1.25/month plus \$0.05/m3 of water used starting November 1, 2022. Paving Update:

The actual paving of 48th Street between 50th Avenue and 52nd Avenue with an apron onto 51st Avenue part way between 48th Street and 49th Street has begun. 48th Street has been dug out and is currently being built up with gravel. After the gravel is complete, concrete work will begin. They have begun the process of digging out 51st Avenue and 46th Street.

Residents on north side of 51st Avenue are to put their recycling and garbage bins in the back alley for pick up until paving is complete.

Once any concrete is poured, we ask that it is not driven on for at least 7 days to allow for the concrete to cure properly and obtain the strength required to support a vehicle weight.
