Shop Local Campaign

Positive feedback was received for the Village's first attempt at a Shop Local campaign, encouraging residents to 'think local' first when making purchases.

Nearly 700 transactions involving 83 residents were recorded during the campaign. The effort, originally planned for the month of July, was extended to include August, building on initial positive interest and allowing more time for residents to participate. The campaign included the chance to win a prize for any resident shopping local (and getting their card signed) during the campaign, with the odds of winning increasing with more purchases.

Ten businesses participated through promoting the campaign and signing purchase cards. Another few businesses graciously contributed to the draw prizes. Eight prizes in total were provided by Village businesses. Congratulations to the following shopping winners:

While representing a grassroot effort, the campaign is part of the Village's broader economic development plan, which includes strengthening the local commercial base. As shared previously, while the majority of retail spending 'leaks' outside the Village, common for smaller communities located near major centres, residents express a desire to support local:

- 100% of residents agree that having local shopping options is important and 62% indicate this is *very* important
- residents are willing to pay on average a 13% premium over big city prices to have local options (recognizing businesses incur transportation fees to bring products in)

The Village's retail analysis shows strong potential exists for increased local business - residents (including the Kart club and county residents in the broader trading area) indicate the potential exists to spend up to \$3.3 million more annually if a broader selection of goods and services is available.

So the potential is there! But it starts with supporting the businesses we have to make Main Street more vibrant and encourage expansion of offerings. And vibrant local business creates jobs and helps attracts residents, which drives more commerce, in a virtuous cycle.

Watch for the next version of the Shop Local campaign and keep working with area businesses to build a thriving commercial sector in the Village.

TREASURES Thrift store in Warburg was created in 2018, and we have had the pleasure of serving the Village of Warburg and surrounding areas since then.

United Churches and Thrift stores have had a special relationship for more than 40 years, and Thorsby United Church ran one for many of those. When the Thorsby Thrift closed in 2017, the congregations of Warburg (Central) and Telfordville decided to move the Thrift store to Warburg. Patterning our store after the one in Devon, we reorganized our building space to accommodate this new venture, and we opened our doors to the community on July 18, 2018.

Over the past 4 years, we have enjoyed meeting some wonderful people from near and far. We have been so appreciative of the positive feed-back from everyone who visits. We strive to keep our store clean and welcoming, and we try to display our wares in a pleasing manner.

We sell clothing for men, women, boys, girls, toddlers and babies. We also have a great assortment of housewares, toys, books, purses, shoes and several surprise items. A percentage of our proceeds are donated back to the community every year.

TREASURES Thrift Store is built on the generosity of the community. We accept donations of CLEAN, gently used items during business hours on Wednesdays. Due to space limitations, we cannot accept donations of furniture, sports equipment (including skates) or pet items. Also, we cannot accept any safety related items such as helmets or baby seats.

We have a four full-time volunteers, including Lynn Dwyer and Nancy Swartz in the receiving and sorting area and Brenda Kshyk and Janet Rosenke in the sales area. Courtney Tisdale also helps out when we need her.

Could they be a benefit to you?

Seniors Services provides preventative social programs that assist seniors and adults with disabilities in maintaining their independence and enhancing their quality of life.

Provides access to affordable housekeeping services through a partnership with Serving Hands Senior Care Inc.

To be eligible for the housekeeping subsidy, you must:

- Be a senior (65+) or an adult with a disability or inability to complete household task.
- · Meet annual income thresholds.
- . Be a resident of Leduc County (including New Sarepta), Calmar, Thorsby or Warburg.

Housekeeping fees are determined based on family income level and eligibility to other subsidies. Seniors who are eligible for subsidy from the Government of Alberta will be assisted with applications

Seniors Services also offers one-to-one support to assist you with:

- · Information and referrals to other local resources
- Assistance with forms and applications.
- Advocacy and coordination of services.
- Goal setting and future planning.

Subsidized counselling service

Short-term preventative counselling supports people who are struggling with common, everyday issues. Leduc County Family and Community Support Services (FCSS) offers subsidy to residents of rural Leduc County, Calmar, Thorsby and Warburg to ensure everyone can afford the cost of counselling.

Counselling fees are determined on a sliding scale based on family income and family size. In order to be eligible for subsidy, your family income must be less than \$75,000 per year. Services are provided by local counsellors and are available in person, over the phone or virtually.




