

Council Notes

October 11, 2022 Council Meeting

Parking Commercial Vehicle

Council moved that the Village grant JAW'S Backhoe Service a variance to Bylaw #133/14 to allow for parking of his commercial vehicle on the street in front of his residence for six months.

Leduc County Grader Parking

Council approved the Memorandum of Understanding between Leduc County and Village of Warburg for the parking of one motor grader in the Warburg Public Works compound.

Community Support—Project Apollo

Council approved that the Village sponsor Project Apollo in the amount of \$2500.00 as per the request from Warburg Parent School Society and that they encourage Black Gold School Division to contribute to the playground project.

Rogers Telecommunication Facility

The Village supports the construction of a 35m lattice tripole tower but do not approve the potential sites due to the proximity to residential zoning.

Muniware Software Quotation

Council approved the purchase of 6 core modules and the remote meter reading integration for the amount of \$32,400.00 plus an annual support cost of \$6,870.00 for updated municipal software.

Chili Cook Off Council Expense

Council approved that Councillors wishing to expense the community events be permitted to do so if such event is approved by Council.

2023 Fortis Franchise Fee

Council approved that the 2023 Fortis Franchise Fee remain at 10%.

Paving Project

Council moved that the Village will not require the front fence to be reinstalled a the Centennial Park.

Holiday Season Office Closure, Open House, and Celebration

Council moved that the office be closed on December 23rd, 26th and January 2nd for the Holiday season and that the Christmas Open House be held on December 20th from 3pm-6pm and that the Village council and staff Christmas Celebration be held on December 10th.

Deputy Mayor

As per resolution #8013-10-21 Councillor Laing was appointed Deputy Mayor for the second year.

Warburg Library Board

Village of Warburg Council appointed Shannon Sontag and Jessica Charbonneau Banks for a three-year term to the Warburg Library Board.
