





Understanding Resistance in Children and/or Teens

Children are naturally inclined to resist and oppose when feeling pressured or controlled. Although the reaction is quite normal and even healthy in certain circumstances, its manifestations and impact can be highly disruptive and disturbing, making life difficult for parents and teachers. Counterwill can take many forms from negativism to noncompliance depending upon the age and personality of the child or teen. We will discuss the meaning of this deep-rooted instinct as well as the dynamics that control its existence and expression.


We are planning some out of town trips this summer and fall. If you are interested in the trips there will be sign up sheets at the Village office.


Warburg Rocks!!!






Village of Warburg has set the 2023 property tax payment deadline to July 31, 2023 with an August 1, 2023 tax penalty date.



May 8th, 2023 Council Meeting

Life Station Electrical Control Panel

Council approved Camenex Control Systems Ltd.'s quote of \$27,600.00 plus GST for a new lift station electrical control panel at the Village Green lift station.

2023 Sidewalk Project

Council will have administration price out a cement grinder to purchase or to purchase with a 39/20 partner, if they are wishing to do so; and that public works, administration and Council forward any priorities for sidewalk replacement or construction of sidewalks for 2023.

Leduc & District Food Bank AGM

Council approved that anyone wishing to attend the Leduc and District Food Bank AGM be authorized to do so.

Collection Agency

Council moved that administration get further information from other collection agencies along with costs to provide service for the next meeting.

Bylaw #188/23 to Authorize Rates of Taxation to be Levied Against Assessable Property

Council gave final reading to Bylaw #188/23 which authorizes rates of taxation to be levied against assessable property within the Village of Warburg for the 2023 year. Bylaw #188/23 can be found on the warburg.ca website under Council—> Bylaws—> Taxes

Skateboard Park

Council approved the purchase of a skate park ramp that will be placed ,on a cement pad, in the Village park area that can be accessed off of 46 Street and 51 Avenue or from the alley east of 48 Street between 50 Ave and 52 Ave. Council approved that the Village of Warburg contract McConnell to move the skateboard park equipment in the amount of \$9,000.00 on condition that they have insurance to cover any damages.

Amending Bylaw #133/14 Section (5.6)

Council gave final reading to Bylaw #133/14 with the addition of Section 5.6 which falls under Section 5—Parking on Private Land. Section 5.6 states that a truck and trailer unit loaded with a GVWR less than 12,000 kg may park fully inside a residential garage only if the following conditions are met: a) parking may be year round; b) a non-transferrable permit is purchased at a price of \$100 per calendar year; c) no parking on the street or driveway will be permitted.

Vacant Lot Listing

Council has approved that the lot at 5015-53rd Avenue be re-listed for \$20,000.00 and lots 4516, 4520, 4524-50th Avenue be re-listed for \$40,000.00 each as recommended by Dawn Heisler, ReMax Real Estate.

The 2023 Taxation Notice & Property Assessments were mailed out on Friday, May 19, 2023. The 2023 property tax payment deadline is July 31, 2023 with an August 1, 2023 tax penalty date. For more information, see the insert that came with your Tax Notice.
