


LEDUC COUNTY GRANTS





Confronting the Uncomfortable: A Series on Anti-Oppression and Anti-Racism

Join Leduc County Family and Community Support Services (FCSS) for this virtual series tackling the topics of anti-oppression and anti-racism. These sessions are a part of a series – you'll register for the whole series but feel free to attend one or both. These introductory sessions are open to adults and professionals.

Session one: Fundamentals in Anti-Oppression (Thursday, Sept. 7, 2023)

Join us for an important conversation about the history of oppression in Canada and how it is connected to biases, prejudices and discrimination. We will discuss how this history continues to affect us locally, and discuss where we can see biases, prejudice and discrimination impacting our community today.

Session two: Anti-Racism: Learning to Confront the Uncomfortable (Thursday, Sept. 21, 2023) This session will help us better understand racism by examining its foundation and challenging common misunderstandings. It's a chance for us to reflect on what we know and what we think we know, using a critical social justice framework. Building an anti-racist society begins within ourselves and is an on-going journey of unlearning, bravery, and empathy. We hope participants will leave this session feeling more comfortable with the uncomfortable and have a clearer understanding of terms and ideas that are commonly used in conversations about race and racism.

This series is presented by Leduc County Family and Community Support Services (FCSS) in partnership with the John Humphrey Centre for Peace and Human Rights (JHC). JHC develops and delivers education and training to support communities, organizations, and individuals to embed human rights, build equity and address discrimination.

Saturday, September 30, 2017

A day to listen, learn, and celebrate Aboriginal culture

Why Orange Shirts?

Orange Shirt Day is a legacy of the St. Joseph Mission (SJM) residential school commemoration event held in Williams Lake, BC, Canada, in May 2013. It grew out of Phyllis'story of having her shiny new orange shirt taken away on her first day of school at the Mission, and it has become an opportunity to keep the discussion on all aspects of residential schools happening annually. The date was chosen because it is the time of year in which children were taken from their homes to residential schools, and because it is an opportunity to set the stage for anti-racism and anti-bullying policies for the coming school year. It also gives teachers time to plan events that will include children, as we want to ensure that we are passing the story and learning on to the next generations.

<u>Orange Shirt Day</u> is also an opportunity for First Nations, local governments, schools and communities to come together in the spirit of reconciliation and hope for generations of children to come.


Aboriginal Peoples and Culture

Are you a fresh fruit and vegetable business interested in, or expanding into the retail, wholesale or food service made ts? The Preparing for CanadaGAP webbar series will help to create an understanding of the application process and break down its requirements and process into clear steps.

Participants will walk through the CanadaGAP manual with presenter, Erin Hiebert, Manager of Food Safety and Skills Development at the Saskatchewan Food Center.

Join the group enercises and have your business questions answered about this certification standard. Guest speakers from the industry will join to share their experiences with CanadaGAP proparation and certification.

Why CanadaCAP? Implementing CanadaCAP into your business provides assurance to retail and foodservice buyers. It will:

- ensure you are meeting your customer requirements for safe food
- position your business to access new market channels
- increase the opportunity for financial success

Businesses with CanadaGAP meet the preventive control plan requirements of the Safe Food for Canadians Act and Regulations (SFCR).

At this interactive workshop, you will learn how to:

- Break down the CanadaGAP requirements into easy-to-understand instructions.
- Identify the steps to prepare for your first. certification audit.
- Manage the risks associated with fresh produce and increase your marketing capacity.
- Develop and implement standard operating procedures (SOPs).
- Explore why good record leeping is important.
- Merge program requirements with your existing record leeping system.
- Usten to guest speakers from foodservices and retail that require CanadaGAP, and from a producer that has CanadaGAP certification.

- Six week sessions: weeks of Nov. 1 to Dec. 6, 2023 (2.5 hour per session).

August 14th, 2023 Council Meeting

RCMP CAPTURE Program

Council approved that the Village of Warburg support the CAPTURE. Community Assisted Policing Through Use of Recorded Evidence program in order to help the police investigate crimes and keep our community safe by registering our cameras. Murals

Council approved that the Village of Warburg pursue Robert Murray to do murals on the Pumphouse, Water Treatment Plant and Community Park Washroom to a maximum of \$10,000.00

Bulk Water

Council moved that the Village monitor the bulk water coin fill, now that minor repairs were made, and that a sign with instructions and a phone number by posted at the bulk water station.

Concrete Grinder

Council approved that the Village purchase the scarifier along with a set of consumables to have in stock. This will be a great asset that can level the top layer of concrete surfaces.

Service LineWarranties
