# **National Youth Remembrance Contests**

This is offered to all students during The Poppy Campaign each November with all branches of Legions through the Royal Canadian Legion. There are prizes awarded on all levels.

**Video** – Participants are challenged to exercise their creative story telling skill to create a short video on the theme of Remembrance.

Video must be submitted though RemembranceContests.ca This is open to grade 7 to 12 students in the Canadian School system. Parental permission is required on a form for submission.

**Poster & Literacy - Participants** are challenged to exercise their artistic ability to create a poster on the theme of Remembrance. Open from Kindergarten to Grade 12 students can enjoy completing a color poster or a black and white.

Winning entries at the Legion Branch level move forward to the Legion's Provincial level contests. Finalists are then forwarded to the Legion National Foundation in Ottawa to be judged on National Level. At the different levels, these entries are displayed in the Canadian War Museum and the foyer of the Parliament Buildings. All entries are returned to their owners.

For Literacy, Participants are challenged to exercise their creative writing skills to write an essay and/or poem on the Theme of Remembrance. All winning entries displayed as the previous paragraph.







can support their child's skill building.



# Seniors Assisted Transportation Subsidy

Pilot project Sept. 1 to Dec. 31, 2023

The cost of transportation can be a barrier for many rural seniors. Leduc County FCSS provides a subsidy to eligible older adults (65+) who need transportation for medical appointments. Drive Happiness is a non-profit that provides safe, reliable and affordable assisted transportation to low-resource seniors.

# Eligibility

- At least 65 years of age
- Resident of Leduc County, Town of Calmar, Town of Thorsby or Village of Warburg
- > Have sufficient mobility to enter and exit vehicles independently

# Number of rides

- Seniors 65 years to 79 years are eligible for five free round trips for medical appointments.
- Seniors 80 years and older are eligible for 10 free round trips for medical, recreational, social or supportive needs.

# Memberships

All program participants are required to purchase a Drive Happiness annual membership. Membership fees are determined by Drive Happiness and are based on household income.

Members pay for their food basket on or by the first Friday of each month and you receive your food on the third Thursday of the month. Check calendar for exceptions to order and pick up dates Months with changes to dates.

What is WECAN?

We are a not for profit organization that believes everyone has the right to purchase fresh fruit and vegetables and freshly frozen meat at an affordable price.

How much does this cost?

The cost for one full order is \$35.00 per month.

What will I get for my \$35.00?

You will receive three types of fruit, 3 types of vegetables and two or three different types of freshly frozen meat. (12 servings))

How do I know that this food is any good?

We have a team of dedicated volunteers who meet once a month with the supplier to order the fruits and vegetables and then on the morning of depot days we have a group of volunteers who help sort and pack the orders for the depots and our team looks over the order to make sure that everything is good.

How is WECAN able to offer food at an affordable price?

We are able to do this because we are buying in bulk.

How does this work?

Our members pay by the first Friday of the month and pick up their prepaid order on the third Thursday of the month. I will phone to remind you of the pickup date and time.

Where does the food come from?

The Grocery People Warehouse is our supplier.

Can I pick and choose what I want?

No you are unable to pick and choose what goes into your order as we are buying in bulk and that is how we are able to keep the cost

I don't eat pork, what can I do about this?

Pork is the only meat item that can be substituted, and this is for religious purposes.

Are there any forms to fill out?

There are no forms to fill out. All we ask for is your name and phone number.

How do I pay for this and when do I get my food?

Payment is due on the 1<sup>st</sup> Friday of each month and you get your food on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Thursday of each month. Put your cash in an envelop along with your name and phone number and drop it off at the Food Bank.

Can I buy more than one order?

Yes you can purchase more than 1 order, but just remember it will be a duplicate of the original order. You can purchase additional meat for \$20.00 or additional produce for \$15.00 or both for an extra \$35.00

Will this save me money?

Generally members receive significant savings as we purchase in bulk at wholesale prices

Where will I pick up my order?

Your order will be delivered to the Leduc & District Food Bank 6051B - 47St - Pick up between 2:30 pm and 4:00 pm. Do I have to order every month? No you don't have to place an order every month.

Can I pay in advance for my order?

Yes you must prepay for your order. You can pay when you pickup your order.

Do you accept debit or credit cards?

You can contact WECAN at www.wecanfood.com and arrange to purchase the food using a debit or credit card.


