REMINDERS

Cat and/or Dog Licenses

Cat and dog licenses must be registered/renewed as of January 31st, 2024. Residents can pick up a form at the Village office or they can be found on the www.warburg.ca website. A copy is included with the January 2024 Village of Warburg utility bill.

Business Licenses

As per Bylaw 156/18, any person or persons operating a business or providing goods or services to the residents of the Village of Warburg must hold a current Business License. A Business License covers the calendar year of January 1 to December 31. The cost of such license is \$25.00/per year/per business for Home Based Businesses and Businesses located within the Village, and \$50.00 for businesses located outside of the Village, Hawkers/ Peddlers and Single Projects.

Bylaw 168/20 Cat Bylaw

PART 2 – LICENSING

- 4. Every Person residing within the jurisdiction of the Village who is the owner of a Cat over the age of six months shall obtain, on an annual basis, a license for that Cat as determined by Council from time to time, and set out in Schedule “A”.
- 6. Licenses issued under this Bylaw shall not be transferable from one Cat to another or from one Owner to another.
- 9. No more than two (2) Cats shall be harbored, suffered or permitted to remain upon or in any land, house, shelter, room or place, building structure or premises within the village.

Per Schedule B of Bylaw 168/20, failure to obtain a valid Cat license will result in a penalty as follows:

PART 2 – LICENSING

- 4. Every Person residing within the jurisdiction of the Village who is the owner of a Dog over the age of six months shall obtain, on an annual basis, a license for that Dog as determined by Council from time to time, and set out in Schedule “A”.
- 6. Licenses issued under this Bylaw shall not be transferable from one Dog to another or from one Owner to another.
- 7. The Owner shall ensure that the license tag is securely fastened to a collar or harness that must be worn by the Dog at all times when it is off the premises of the Owner.

Per Schedule B of Bylaw 99/10, failure to obtain a valid Dog license will result in a penalty as follows:

Section 3 Fail to obtain valid Dog license \$100.00
