Leduc County wants to remind everyone to be on alert for various phone, <u>internet</u> and other scams and to educate and protect yourself against fraud. One example happening now is someone calls and claims to be from an internet, cable or cellphone service provider offering a deal that's too good to be true and asks for the victim's personal information. Once received, they can use that information for identity fraud.

If you get a call from your service provider, tell them you will call them back and end the call. Look up the legitimate phone number for the company and communicate with them directly by always making the outgoing call.

- Changes in hygiene
- Seeming fearful around certain people
- Fear or worry when talking about money

Each summer we are closed for the months of July and August, however the hall will be available for rent.


