





3/4 TEASPOON DRIED BASIL 1/2 TEASPOON ONION SALT

1/2 TEASPOON SALT 1/4 TEASPOON PEPPER

1/4 TEASPOON DRIED THYME

1 PACKAGE (9 OUNCES) REFRIGERATED CHEESE RAVIOLI

1/4 CUP GRATED PARMESAN CHEESE

ADDITIONAL MINCED FRESH PARSLEY, OPTIONAL

DIRECTIONS

IN A DUTCH OVEN, COOK BEEF OVER MEDIUM HEAT UNTIL NO LONGER PINK, 5-7 MINUTES, BREAKING IT INTO CRUMBLES; DRAIN. 

September 9th, 2024 Council Meeting

Community Awareness Night

Council approved that any member of Council that is available to attend the Warburg Community Awareness Night on September 12th, 2024 be authorized to do so.

ATCO Franchise Fee & FORTIS Franchise Fee

Council moved that the Village keep the ATCO Franchise Fee at 10% for 2025 as well as make no change to the FORTIS Franchise Fee which will remain at 10%.

Utilities Affordability Statutes Amendment Act

Council moved that the Village of Warburg agree to the Franchise Agreement Re-Approval Process as per the Utilities Affordability Act, 2024 and take the necessary action to prevent the franchise agreement from being terminated by this new law. *Key changes can be found at https://www.alberta.ca/making-utility-bills-more-affordable

BBQ & Chili Cook Off

Council approved that the Village send invites to MP Soroka, MP Lake, MLA Boitchenko and to Leduc County Council for the BBQ & Chili Cook Off on September 20th, 2024.

Jasper Fire Community Fund

Council approved that the Village donate \$1000.00 to the Jasper Community Team Society.

5204-50th Avenue Request to Change Zoning

Council moved that the Village of Warburg will consider changing Section 71: C1 Commercial Central District of the Land Use Bylaw to add Caretaker's Residence to the Discretionary Uses.

Old Brush Mower

Council moved that the Village advertise to sell the old brush mower, as inoperable and if not sold in a couple of months, we will revisit selling it through auction.

Demolition Grounds—Tires and Cement Blocks

Council moved that the Village issue a letter to the Demolition Derby Committee requesting them to remove the old tires and cement blocks from the property formerly used for demolition derby events by October 15th, 2024.

RV Park Attendant

Council moved that the Village offer the RV Park Caretaker position to Mr. Danielson for the 2025 Camping season from May 1, 2025—September 30, 2025, in which on RV site will be reserved for Mr. Danielson at no cost.
