
Walk for Wenjack







NOTICE FOR VILLAGE OF WARBURG RESIDENTS

Amidst the current and ongoing Canada Post strike, the monthly utility bills will not be delivered via Canada Post.

To receive your utility bills the following options are available:

1. Come into the Village Office to collect your monthly Utility Bill, bills will be available by October 3rd, 2025. The office is open Monday-Thursday 8:30am-12:00 pm and 1:00pm-5:00pm.

2. Call the Village Office and we will, until the strike has concluded, give you your balance over the phone or we can email you a copy of your utility bill upon request.

Please note that all deadlines and penalties are still in effect during the strike with payments due by October 31st, 2025. Bills can be paid in office and online and e-transfers sent to office@warburg.ca

IMPORTANT NOTICE

Waste Services provider Change

As of October 6th, 2025 the Village of Warburg will be utilizing Integrity Waste Solutions for our garbage and recycling pickup.

Important Notes:

- Garbage and recycling pickup dates WILL NOT change. The schedule is continuing for the 2025/2026 year.
- We ask that garbage and recycling be placed at the curb by 7:00 am on the date of collection.
- Please ensure all bins have appropriate clearance of 4 feet around all sides, are not obstructed by objects above bin, and are placed on level ground for efficient collection.
- Ensure items in bins are bagged, and that bins are not overflowing. Lids must able to close. Remember that if a bin is too tightly packed, it may not empty properly.
- Recycling must be inside of blue bags, with large recycling collapsed and neatly bundled beneath the blue bag.

The bins will remain the same. No new bins will be issued, as the new service provider will continue using the existing bins. Therefore, there is no need to leave them out for collection after the September 30, 2025 garbage pickup.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION PLACING YOUR WASTE CARTS **FOR COLLECTION**

FRONT STREET CART PLACEMENT







CART COLLECTION

- 1. All cart lids must close completely
- 2. Please bag materials in the waste cart. Carts must not be over-packed. Tightly packed carts do not emply properly when jammed full and can result in damage to carts and/or property and excessive litter/loose debns
- 3. Place your cart out on your collection day by ?am.
- 4. Ensure 1m (4 ft) clearance all around and above cart lincluding between carts and bags and parked
- 5. Face carts to roadway, spaced appropriately using all available space to either side of driveways
- 6. Cart should be placed clear of any overhead obstructions, such as trees, powerlines, or roof overhangs
- 7. Carts should be placed on level ground. In winter this may require cleaning snow for cart placement.

STUCK MATERIALS

Residents are responsible for loading carts in a manner that allows carts to empty freely when inverted. Collection operators are not responsible for

September 8th, 2025 Council Meeting

ATCO Franchise Fee & FORTIS Franchise Fee

Council moved that the Village keep the ATCO Franchise Fee and FORTIS Franchise Fee at 10% for 2026.

BBQ & Chili Cook Off

Council moved that any member of Council wanting to attend the Annual Community Chili Cook Off on September 25th be authorized to do so.

Warburg Cultural Society Support Letter

Council moved that the Village of Warburg send a Letter of Support for the Warburg Cultural Society grant application for air conditioning.

Road Closures

Council approved the temporary road closures on 52nd Street from 50th Avenue to 51st Avenue for August 30th and September 13th, 2025.

Irresponsible Pet Owners

Council approved that a dozen "Pick Up Your Dog Poop" signs be posted around the Village, and that a social media campaign be initiated.

Request for Permission to Allow Residents at 5204-50th Avenue

Council denied the request to permit 2 to 3 residents to reside at the commercial property located at 5 204-50th Avenue.

Assessment Contract to 2030

Council approved Powers & Associates Appraisal Services Inc. contract for assessment from 2026 to 2030.

Catalis Contract

Council approved the agreement with Catalis for our Municipal Software License.

Crosswalks

Council moved that the Village of Warburg paint crosswalks and install crosswalk signs on 52nd Avenue and 48th Street where the sidewalks switch from one side of the street to the other.

Bylaw #81/07 Amending Section 9 and Fees

Amendment to Bylaw 81/07 pertains to allowing for households to have up to 3 dogs with a higher license fee of \$100 for the 3rd dog registered. The Bylaw amendment received first and second reading with a motion to do the third reading was defeated. This will be brought before Council again at the October 14th, 2025 Regular Meeting.
